





cartographer - A person who draws maps.


continents - Large areas which have lots of countries in them.

A compass


A compass shows direction. There are four main directions on a compass north, south, east and west. The needle on a compass always points north.

When drawing maps, we usually draw objects from a birds eye view. This means we draw them showing what they look like from high above them.



















Homework Ideas
