Travel and transport

Children explore the prehistoric world, learning how our ancestors survived and about creatures that roamed the Earth thousands of years ago. They will discover elements of the era through landmarks and artefacts.



In this unit, children will learn about the three eras of prehistoric Britain: Stone age, Bronze and Iron age. They will understand how human-kind has evolved and develop their historical enquiry skills.

Children learn about Egyptian life, including the importance of the Nile. They plan and make their own shadufs and discover what the pyramids were and about key Pharaohs.

Focussing on seaside holidays, children will explore how people holidayed in the past and how that might be different in present times.

Roman Britain

Children have a Roman workshop led by a visiting expert. They learn about life in Roman Britain and their impact on us today.

Ancient Greece

This unit will explore the Ancient Greek's legacy from democracy, education and philosophy.
