All classes took the time to think about mental health in an age-appropriate way and the importance of talking to someone if they don't feel OK. #### Attendance.

School attendance remains a priority at Colmers Farm Primary School. An attendance of 90% or below is recognised as Persistently Absent (PA) and equates to 19 days missed over a school year. Once a child has been absent for 19 days or more, they remain PA for the rest of the academic year. When a child accumulates 10 days absent, they are identified as 'Risk of Persistent Absence' As you know, to achieve their full potential a student must have regular high attendance and punctuality.

We understand that there are of course, genuine reasons (such as illness), which can make attendance at school difficult, therefore we would urge you to encourage your child to attend every day that they can. We value your support with this matter.



To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: Can you tell me who is in your family?

Year 1: What is a past tense verb?

Year 2: What happened to the Titanic?

Year 3: What's the difference between an exoskeleton and an endoskeleton?

Year 4: What is your opinion of Boudica? Do you think that she was right to rebel against

the Romans? Why?

Year 5: What do you know about North America?

Year 6: What is a subordinate clause?
