

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: What happened to stickman?

Year 1: What happens to the day length during Winter?

Year 2: Is 3x2 the same as 2x3? Explain how you know.

Year 3: How are shadows formed?

Year 4: How are mountains formed and what is the largest mountain in the world?

Year 5: Would you rather live in Ancient Athens or Ancient Sparta? Why?

Year 6: How were the finches adapted on the Galapagos Islands?
