KS2 School Parliament.

KS1 School Council.

After School Clubs.

At Colmers Farm, we take pride in our wide range of clubs, which this year also includes Young Voices Club which is open to children in Years 3 to 6. The children will work hard and practice ready to perform at Resorts World Arena, as part of the world's largest children's choir, in early 2025.



Arrival at school safely.

As always, we are grateful to Morrisons for allowing parents and carers to park in their carpark at the start and the end of the school day. It is essential that the disabled parking bays are only used by parents / carers who are displaying a blue badge, and not just for convenience. Understandably, those with a blue badge require



those parking bays to always be available. Concerns have also been raised regarding children being driven to school not in appropriate car seats or wearing seatbelts. Please see the guidance below with regards to this safeguarding matter.



Attendance and punctuality.

Attendance remains a high priority for Colmers Farm Primary School pupils. The first week back has seen a whole school attendance of 94% which is a good start, although we aim to have 96% attendance and will continue to push to achieve this. Holidays in term time have a huge impact on pupils' attainment and friendships as well as on whole school attendance and should not be booked.

The gates to the playground are closed promptly at 8:45am. After this time children will have to enter school through the main school office and must be signed in electronically by the adult who has brought them to school. Although we understand that sometimes lateness cannot be avoided, children should not regularly be arriving late to school as they will then miss the start of their learning for the day.






Tesco Stronger Starts


