We will also be supporting:


'Mental Health Awareness Day' on Thursday 10th October where the children can wear something yellow.



ORACY Questions to ask your child.

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question in order to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: What sounds have you learnt this week? Year 1: When do we use capital letters and full stops? Year 2: Tell me about the Wright brothers. Year 3: Can you name 3 cities in Brazil? Year 4: What do you know about the Roman Empire? What countries were part of it? Year 5: What is gravity? Who discovered it and how? Year 6: What was an interesting fact that you learnt about the Mongolian Steamer?
