Year 3:	Can you greet your family in French?
Year 4:	What is the most interesting thing you've learnt about Roman Britain?
Year 5:	Can you tell me what an expanded noun phase is and give an example?
Year 6:	What is an inherited characteristic

Our current school attendance to date is 93.1% - let's get this up to 96%!



Weekly Assembly


Ask your child to tell you about the story behind the pictures we looked at in assembly this week and how it relates to British Values, Rights Respecting articles and No Outsiders.
