




Parents Lottery

Reception: What happened to little red riding hood?

Year 1: What happened during the Great Fire of London?

Year 2: What is an adjective?

Year 3: What type of rock would be best to use for a roof? Why?

Year 4: What do you know about thunder and lightning?

Year 5: What might we use thermal insulators for?

Year 6: Can you give me an example of a casual conjunction?

TYPES OF LATENESS

- 1. Late before register closes at 9:15 am Your child is a few minutes late They are likely to feel unsettled and embarrassed as they start morning lessons.

- 2. Late after register closes at 9:15 am This counts as an unauthorised absence and will show on your child's attendance record. Your child is likely to have missed the start of lessons and could feel unsettled, embarrassed and much less confident than their classmates as the lesson moves on.


