We welcomed Birmingham City Mission into school on Thursday to deliver an assembly to pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. This assembly was about the Harvest Festival and gave children time to reflect and to be grateful for all they have and

School Trips.

We have listened to parent feedback about spreading the cost of trips/workshops across the year and being able to pay via smaller instalments which is why we will be trying our very best to send out notification of trips/workshops with as much notice as possible this year.

In the 'Trips' tab on the Arbor app, smaller regular amounts (even £1) can be added to your child's account, in increments up to the full cost. These smaller amounts can also be paid in the school office using our card machine at any time.



The law around school trips is very clear – we are unable to only take children who pay, and we can only ask for voluntary contributions. Therefore, if we do not get enough payments for a trip to be financially viable, we will

have no option other than to cancel it for all children.

In a further attempt to reduce costs of school trips, Excelsior have bought brand new minibuses. A cost for a coach for a school trip is around £600 for the day, which would be approximately £10 per pupil on top of



any trip cost. Using the minibuses will ensure costs are kept to a minimum in the hope that all trips can go ahead this year.

This week our Year 5 and 6 Football team entered a competition at the Blues Training ground, Wast Hills and came 2nd our of the 6 teams. The boys played so well, and their sportsmanship was excellent. A special shout out to Oliver for his excellent goalkeeping skills.

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question in order to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: Can you tell us who the characters are in The Gruffalo?

Year 1: What is a fish, reptile and amphibian?

Year 2: What advice would you give to the Worrysaurua?

Year 3: How many 10s make 100? What about 700?

Year 4: Was Julius Ceasar right to try to invade Britain?

Year 5: When is it good to have air resistance and when is it bad?

Year 6: What is a multi-clause complex sentence?


