Breakfast and After School Wrap Around

Please note that at Colmers Farm we have a breakfast club and an after-school wrap around provision for those parents who may need to use these.

Our breakfast club runs from 7:35 until the start of the school day. This costs £2.50 per day.

Our after-school wrap around provision runs from the end of the school day until 5:30. This costs £5 per day.

Both of these provisions are available to any pupil who attends Colmers Farm and they can be booked via the Arbor or the school office. Please ensure that all booking are made at least 24 hours prior to the provision you wish to use.

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality continue to be a high priority at Colmers Farm Primary School. The gates to the playground will be open between 8:30 and 8:45am, and the doors to school will open between 8:35 and 8:45am. The gates and doors will be shut promptly at 8:45 and children arriving after this time will need to go in to school through the main school office and be signed in using the electronic sign-in system. This minimises the risk of children entering school late and not being marked present accurately. Learning starts promptly at 8:50 and it is essential that children are in and ready to start the day by this time. We thank you for your support with this.

And finally...
