


introduced to, allowing us to dive deeper into the stories.

Year 1 and Year 5 buddied up and enjoyed some time reading together.















EYFS - Farm Visit



On Wednesday and Thursday this week the children in Reception visited Attwell Farm Park as part of their Growing and Changing Topic. The children saw lots of different animals and were able to feed and pet them. The children also enjoyed playing on the play area – as did the staff! The children were very well behaved and a teacher from another visiting school said she wished her children were as fantastic - well done Reception!



Social media usage and children.

Unfortunately, we are having more frequent reports of significant unkind behaviour taking place on social media apps such as Whatsapp. With more children having access to their own mobile phones comes more problems. Apps such as Whatsapp have a user minimum age of 13 years old – too young for anyone in primary school. Although children can physically access this app and communicate on it without problems in one respect, their emotional immaturity



leads to it being used inappropriately. There has been evidence of discriminatory language, sexualised language, sharing of inappropriate pictures and extreme bad language and bullying behaviours. This often then comes into school causing upset in the classroom or on the playground. Whilst we do not tolerate such behaviour, we must ask for parents' support by not allowing your children to access age-inappropriate apps. Please check and monitor closely your child's mobile phone use.






The biggest ever football session is about inspiring and empowering the next generation of girl's football.
