ORACY Questions to ask your child.

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: Can you describe the noises fireworks make? Year 1: What are the signs of Autumn? Year 2: How can we keep healthy? Year 3: Can you tell me the story of Rama and Sita? Year 4: What do you know about Pompeii and Mount Vesuvius? Year 5: What is the physical geography like in Australia? Year 6: Tell me what you have enjoyed doing most this week?


Weekly Assembly






Rights Respecting Article
